Georgetown Metro Connection (Blue Bus)

Route 1, the Wisconsin Avenue Line, travels between Georgetown and Foggy Bottom-GWU metro station

Route 2, the M Street Line, travels between the Rosslyn Metro Station, Georgetown and 19th Street and Sunderland Place.

SafeRides Shuttle

The SafeRides Shuttle runs two continuous loops on Thursday night between 10:00 PM and 2:00 AM and on Friday and Saturday nights from 10:00 PM until 3:00 AM. The shuttle reaches each location on the route approximately once every 15-20 minutes.

Students may also call for a ride to or from any location in the Burleith or West Georgetown areas by calling 784-RIDE or the University Department of Public Safety at 687-4343. This service is available Sunday through Wednesday nights from 8:00 PM until 2:00 AM and from Thursday through Saturday nights from 8:00 PM until 3:00 AM.
